Family Resources Community Action is looking for women who are working to stay substance-free and who want to reach their full potential.

Our program has:

- Permanent housing opportunities in a sober house self-governing community
- Supportive services of our Permanent Supportive Housing Program, including:
 - ⇒ GED Instruction
 - ⇒ Life Skills Training
 - ⇒ Other educational opportunities
 - ⇒ Employment readiness and training
 - ⇒ Support groups
 - ⇒ Recreational activities (field trips, social events, etc.)
 - ⇒ Case management

About our housing: Our recovery home is a spacious newly constructed single family house located in a neighborhood close to downtown Woonsocket, Rhode Island. Five women live in a supportive self-governed sober house community. Each resident has an individual bedroom with private bathroom. Residents share common kitchen and living room areas, storage, parking and yard. Individual phone and cable hook-ups are available in each room. Residents have easy access to program services and downtown.

Eligibility: Applicants must meet income, disability, and sobriety requirements and be homeless or at risk of homelessness. Applicants being discharged from treatment facilities will be considered if they meet other program requirements.

About Family Resources Community Action: Family Resources Community Action administers a wide range of services in northern Rhode Island. Our recovery home is a permanent supportive housing program in the continuum of services the agency provides to homeless and near-homeless individuals and families. FRCA also operates the Woonsocket Shelter, counseling and substance abuse treatment services, and employment training programs, as well as helping with emergency food, rental and prescription assistance and other basic needs services for low income households.
